Budget Update

Presenter: Wendy Dau

Discussion We have zeroed out the equipment budget with purchase of the chromebook lab. The majority of the funds are sitting to pay the student mentors until the end of the year. Additional money can go to pay for PD for teachers or additional chromebook labs.

Alyssa Powers: Could aides be provided professional development?

Wendy: Yes, we would need to put in an amendment for this.

The budget for next year should be around \$80,000.

School Improvement Plan

Presenter: Wendy Dau

Discussion CSIP idea handout will be referred to. Trust lands funds. The BLT met and put together goals for the CSIP.

Academic Goal tied to literacy:

When we look at the reading data, 60% of incoming students are behind in reading. At the middle school by the time they leave are only seeing an increase of 9% by the time the student leaves to high school. As a result: 1. 50% of 6th grade students who score below basic, MMS will work to get the student fluent in their reading, 120 wpm. That would be 35 out of the 70 who we are projecting to be there. 2. 50% of 7th and 8th grade students who score below basic on the RI will reach a fluency level of 150 wpm by spring of 2018. 3. Students who score in basic range, we want to see 80% move into proficient. 4. Increase the percent of advanced level students to 6%, and 100% of students who score in the advanced range, stay in that range.

Alyssa Powers: Will a new program be implemented to reach this goal?

Wendy: No, we will use the RI that is already in place.

Willy: What is the essential role of SCC in CSIP Goals

Wendy: Deadline of March 30th if SCC would like to write the goals, if we choose to do so.

What is needed to implement the academic goal of literacy:

Eliminate the Trojan Time that is tied to literacy, and move TT to once a week. The idea would be to have 3 full time reading teachers. If a student is below basic they would be enrolled in the reading class. If 7th and 8th graders need phonics, they will join. After school PE/Health could

be offered for students ELD students will have an ELD class every other day, and a phonics instruction class every other day. Basic level students will have a reading class every other day. This will reduce electives from 4 to 3, if we are able to fund this. If this does not pass, MMS will do TT and a reading class.

Provide literacy instruction in content areas, PD for teachers two times a month for training on the teacher's prep.

Friday late starts, one hour for content teaming, and one hour for cross curricular teaming.

What components of MYP are included in this goal? ATL skill of communication. Literacy includes reading, writing, and speaking.

This would be moving to a targeted intervention

School Climate Goal:

74% of our students are on-track for attendance. The goal would be to increase this to 80%.

Decrease tardiness school wide by 10%.

95% of students will be on-track in discipline (92% right now).

Increase perception of safety and school connectedness by 10% measured by the CAYCI survey.

Richard Hansen: Are students from certain demographic groups feeling less safe than others?

Wendy: We don't know but have asked that the answers for this be disaggregated for next survey which will take place next year.

What is needed to implement school climate goal:

MYP lesson weekly focusing on TOP BRICCK

Alyssa Powers: Wednesday's bell schedule will be a different bell schedule

PD for teachers in how to implement characteristics of the TOP BRICCK in daily lessons

Possible home visits to make connections with families and to provide support where needed

Friday late starts- 1 hour for content teams, one hour for cross curricular

Increased numbers of student mentors to help improve student behavior (possibly increase total number by 2 or 3)

Funds would go to pay teachers for PD, and rewards for PBIS incentives.

A math goal will be added to the CSIP plan.

Questions:

Alyssa Powers: Could PD money go to mentors PD?

Wendy: Yes, they need support

Willy: In these foundational reading and math areas is there a place for volunteers? Does this need to go in the School Improvement Plan?

Wendy: We would love to have more volunteers, we could add this into the budget to train these groups.

Tabbie: I have not seen requests for volunteers, is this something we could increase?

Wendy: Yes, we would love more parent volunteers.

Tabbie: Top Briccck, sounds great, how can we recognize teachers who we know are implementing this in classrooms?

Wendy: Will check into this, would love to provide a reward for teachers who are modeling Top Briccck behavior in classrooms rather than just add one more thing to teachers' plates.
