Review of Past Minutes Presenter: Keila Ellingson

Budget Update & School Trust Lands Amendment

Discussion We have \$25,000 in the budget. We will have about \$12,000 left to come out for aides that are paid out of Trust Lands. \$3,000 has been set aside for supplies. We will use, these funds for our MYP Awards Night and the Make a Difference Project. That leaves us with a carry over, if we do have leftover money we will use this for the purchase of Chromebooks. This would replace an old Chromebook lab.

SCC has no questions about the budget, and is ok with Wendy purchasing Chromebooks with the money. She will proceed with this purchase.

2017-2018 School Improvement Plan & Trust Lands Budget

Presenter: Wendy Dau

Discussion The Overarching Goal and School Community Council Involvement in the CSIP was read from the document.

Academic Goal tied to Literacy:

When we look at the reading data, 60% of incoming students are behind in reading. At the middle school by the time they leave are only seeing an increase of 9% by the time the student leaves to high school. As a result: 1. 50% of 6th grade students who score below basic, MMS will work to get the student fluent in their reading, 120 wpm. That would be 35 out of the 70 who we are projecting to be there. 2. 50% of 7th and 8th grade students who score below basic on the RI will reach a fluency level of I50 wpm by spring of 2018. 3. Students who score in basic range, we want to see 80% move into proficient. 4. Increase the percent of advanced level students to 6%, and 100% of students who score in the advanced range, stay in that range.

The evidence based instructional strategy, systems and structures needed, learning goal, progress monitoring, communication, action plan, and budget was reviewed from the document.

Math Goal:

50% of all student will improve on the math inventory from fall to spring in one level. 100% of students scoring in advanced category will remain in the advanced category.

The evidence based instructional strategy, systems and structures needed, learning goal, progress monitoring, communication, action plan, and budget was reviewed from the document.

School Climate Goal:

Increase student and parent perception of safety and school connectedness by 10% as measured by the CAYCI survey. Data from the spring of 2016 will be compared to survey data which will be gathered spring of 2018 to determine progress.

74% of our students are on-track for attendance. The goal would be to increase this to 80%. Decrease tardiness school wide by 10%. Data for the previous year will be compared with the data from the current year.

95% of students will be on-track in discipline (92% right now).

Tardies decrease by 10% from spring of 2017 to spring of 2018.

The climate enhancing support, systems and structures needed, learning goal, progress monitoring, communication, action plan, and budget was reviewed from the document.

There was a motion to approve, SCC unanimously approved the CSIP and School Trust Lands Budget. All members signed the signature page that will be submitted to the Board of Education.

M.B.- Building resilience and building empathy within our kids is a good place to start. Kids pick up on a lot, and instilling the notion that it is ok to fail.
