We know that many families and students are struggling to get the Internet connections that they need. In order to help, we have provided additional information regarding available Internet connections.

Internet Option	Description	How do I get it?
District Hotspot	The district has a limited number of hotspots that can be checked out (1 per family).	Contact your school's principal.
School Parking Lots	WiFi should be accessible at all school building parking lots. Park as close to the building as possible.	Contact your school's principal with specific questions.
LDS Church Parking Lots	WiFi is available at LDS Church Parking lots.	Contact your local church leaders if you need the username and password for the WiFi. https://www.ldsiving.com/Church-Announces-New-Network-Name-Password-for-Wifi-Access/s/92404
Free Wifi from local businesses	Mcdonalds, Starbucks Parking Lot, Wendy's, Dunkin Donuts, Panera Bread	Use the parking lots of the local businesses listed.
Smartphone WiFi Hotspots	Right now, many mobile phone providers have suspended data limits, giving customers access to unlimited data on their cell phones. This means smartphones can be turned into mobile hotspots to give internet access for up to 2-3 devices at a time.	Contact your mobile phone provider to verify data limit and hotspot options.

Comcast Xfinity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> They are opening their Xfinity WiFi network for free along with providing Unlimited data. Hotspots will be available to anyone who needs them for free including non-subscribers. Use the "xfinitywifi" network name and launch a browser. Data plans will be paused for 60 days to give customers Unlimited data for no additional charge. 	You can find a map of hot spots here .
